



Dear parents,

We would like to inform you about Section 12 of the Education Act, which deals with the school environment of students. This legal provision states that all students have the right to a safe and good school environment that promotes health, well-being, inclusion and learning.

What does this mean for the student?

- The school must work continuously and systematically to ensure that all students experience a safe and good school environment.
- This means that the school must have zero tolerance for offensive behavior such as bullying, violence, discrimination and harassment.
- The school must also facilitate that all students experience being part of a community.

The school's responsibility:

- The school has a duty to act, which means that we must monitor how students are doing and intervene if we see or are told that a student is not doing well at school.
- If a student says that they are not doing well at school, or if we suspect this, the school must investigate the matter and take measures to improve the situation.
- The school must also document what we do to fulfill the activity obligation.

What can you as a parent do?

- Contact the school if you are concerned about your child's school environment.
- Tell us about any experiences or concerns you have.
- Work with the school to find good solutions to ensure that your child is doing well at school.

What happens next?

- The school will contact you to discuss the matter in more detail if you report concerns.
- We will work with you to find measures that can improve the situation for the student.
- We will also inform you about what we are doing and how we follow up on the matter.

We are concerned that all students should enjoy and have a good time at school, and we depend on good cooperation with you as a parent to achieve this. Please feel free to contact us if you have any questions or concerns.
